

**DECISION No MB/2020/14  
of the Management Board  
of the European Union Agency for Cybersecurity  
(ENISA)  
setting up an Advisory Group for the period 2020-2023**

THE MANAGEMENT BOARD OF ENISA,

Having regard to the Regulation (EU) 2019/881 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 17 April 2019 on ENISA (the European Union Agency for Cybersecurity) and on information and communications technology cybersecurity certification and repealing Regulation (EU) No 526/2013 (Cybersecurity Act)<sup>1</sup>, in particular Article 21(1) and (2) thereof;

Having regard to the Decision No MB/2020/02 of the Management Board of ENISA on the Establishment and Operation of the Advisory Group, in particular Articles 1(a) and 2 thereof;

Whereas:

1. it is recommended that a multi-disciplinary group of experts be set-up in order to advise ENISA in respect of the performance of its tasks, except of the provisions of Title III of the Cybersecurity Act, and in particular, advise the Executive Director on the drawing up of a proposal for ENISA's annual work programme, and ensure communication with the relevant stakeholders on issues related to the annual work programme.
2. the Management Board, acting on a proposal from the Executive Director, shall establish in a transparent manner the ENISA Advisory Group which should be composed of:
  - recognised experts representing the relevant stakeholders, such as the ICT industry, providers of electronic communications networks or services available to the public, SMEs, operators of essential services, consumer groups, academic experts in the field of cybersecurity, "ad personam"
  - nominated representatives of competent authorities notified in accordance with Directive (EU) 2018/1972, of European standardization organisations, as well as of law enforcement and data protection supervisory authorities, "nominated representatives".

HAS DECIDED TO ADOPT THE FOLLOWING DECISION:

**Article 1**

### Article 3

The persons identified in Article 1 are hereby appointed as members of the Advisory Group for a term of 2,5 years, which shall run from 1<sup>st</sup> July 2020 to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2022.

### Article 4

Where it is necessary to replace the "ad personam" appointees of the Advisory Group, the Executive Director of ENISA shall propose to the Management Board and the latter will select a name from the reserve list who belongs to the same sector as the person who previously occupied the vacant position on the Advisory Group, according to Article 6 of the Decision No MB/2020/2 of the Management Board of the European Union Agency for Cybersecurity (ENISA) of 3 February 2020 on the establishment and operation of the Advisory Group. The selected person shall hold the position on the Advisory Group for the remainder of its term of establishment.

### Article 5

This Decision shall enter into force on the date of its signature.
