3. Guidelines on tasks of supervisory bodies for trust services

Circulated informally with the Cooperation Group and the eIDAS Committee

Guidelines of SB's task for trust services

Aims to provide supervisory bodies for trust services with guidelines, including general principles and concrete **recommendations** that help these bodies in the exercise of their tasks as listed in Article 46b(4) of the Regulation.

By providing this guidance, the Commission also promotes the adoption of harmonised and best practices among supervisory bodies across the Union.

Qualified certificates for website authentication Art. 45(2)

Sets out reference standards for qualified certificates for website authentication whose purpose is to ensure trust and transparency in online transactions.

Qualified electronic archiving services Art. 45j(2)

Sets out reference standards and specifications for the qualified electronic archiving of electronic data and electronic documents.

Requirements for Qualified trust service providers Art. 24(5)

Provides a list of reference standards, specifications and procedures as regards requirements for qualified trust service providers.

Formats of advanced electronic signatures and seals Art. 27(5) and 37(5)

Provides reference formats of electronic signatures and electronic seals, and reference methods where alternative formats are used.

Qualified electronic ledgers Art. 45l(3)

Will ensure that data recorded in an electronic ledger is chronologically ordered, while remaining immutable, consistent and reliable.



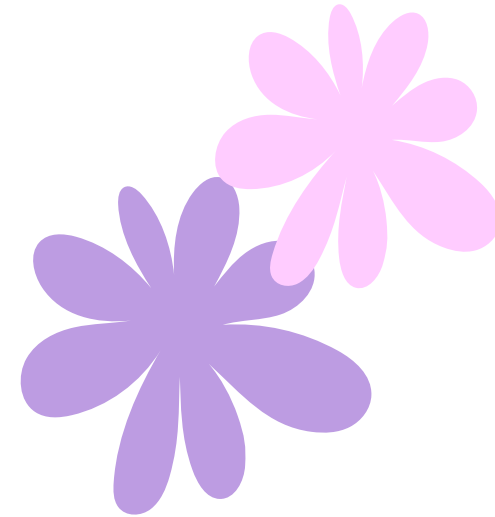
Art. 45(2) – Qualified certificates for website authentication

Commission adoption is planned for 4th quarter 2025.

QWACs Art. 45(2)

This initiative sets out a reference standard and, where needed, specifications and procedures for qualified certificates for website authentication. This is to ensure that:

- there is trust and transparency in online transactions
- the qualified certificates for website authentication include the required information in a verifiable and structured format.

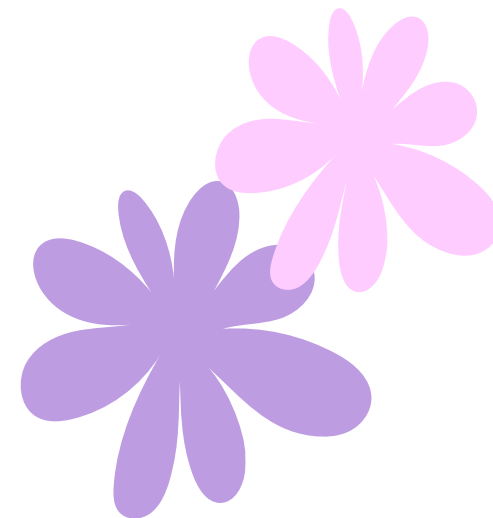
Art. 45j(2) – Qualified electronic archiving services

Commission adoption is planned for 4th quarter 2025.

Qualified electronic archiving services

Art. 45j(2)

- To ensure electronic data and electronic documents are securely preserved, this initiative sets out rules for qualified electronic archiving services.
- It sets out reference standards and, where needed, specifications and procedures for the qualified electronic archiving of documents. These include rules on issuing reports to authorised relying parties.

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Art. 24(5) – Qualified trust service providers

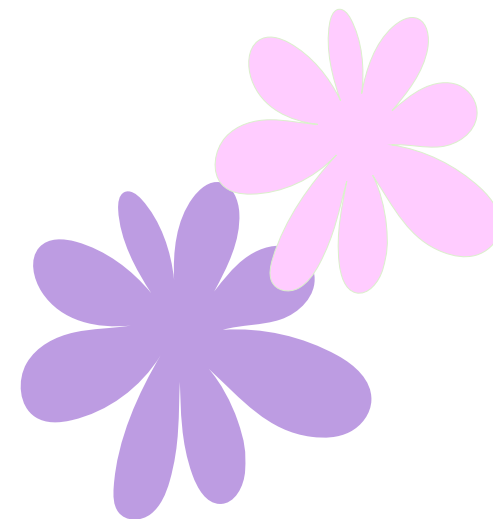
Commission adoption is planned for 4th quarter 2025.

Qualified trust service providers

Art. 24(5)

This initiative provides a list of reference standards, specifications and procedures for qualified trust service providers.

- The standards specifically concern the operation and management practices of qualified trust service providers.
- The procedures concern:
 - termination plans for qualified trust services
 - notifications to the supervisory body
 - the risk management framework that qualified trust service providers must apply.

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Art. 27(5) and 37(5) – Formats of advanced electronic signatures and seals

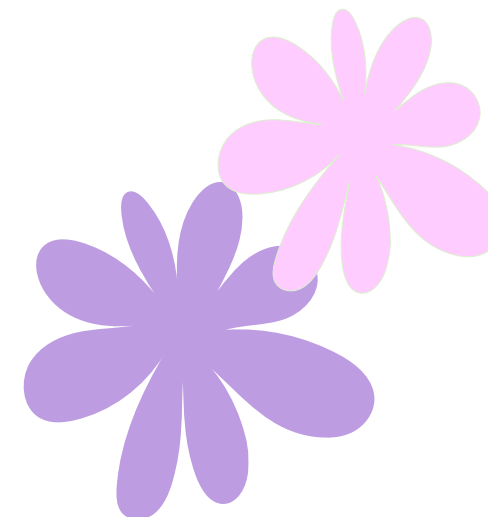
Commission adoption is planned for 4th quarter 2025.

Formats of advanced electronic signatures and seals

Art. 27(5) and 37(5)

This initiative provides for reference formats of advanced electronic signatures and electronic seals, and reference methods where alternative formats are used.

Member States must recognise these formats and methods in order to process electronically signed or sealed documents or data as part of online services offered by, or on behalf of, a public sector body.



Advanced electronic signatures and seals – formats to be recognised by public sector bodies



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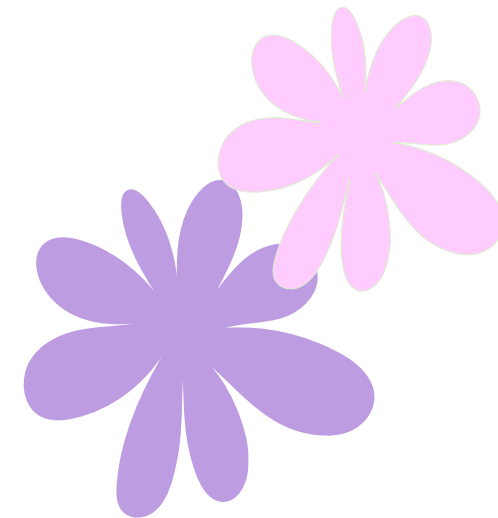
Art. 45l(3) – Qualified electronic ledgers

Qualified electronic ledgers

Art. 45l(3)

To ensure the integrity and the accuracy of the chronological order of electronic data, this initiative sets out a list of reference standards for the requirements on qualified electronic ledgers. These reference standards and specifications will ensure that data recorded in an electronic ledger is chronologically ordered, while remaining immutable, consistent and reliable.

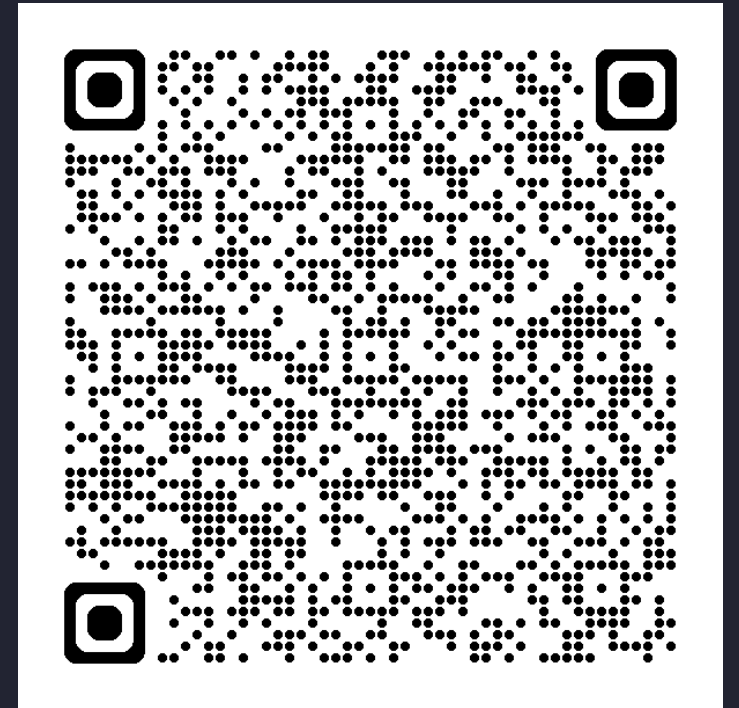

EUDIW onboarding – Art. 5a(24)

This implementing act sets out a list of reference standards and requirements for the onboarding of users to the EUDIW.

Considering the importance of seamless onboarding procedures, the standards and requirements laid down are **intended to provide wallet providers with the necessary framework to conduct user onboarding through remote identity proofing procedures.**
