

# PRIVACY STATEMENT – ENISA CONSULTATION ON EU ICT INDUSTRIAL POLICY

**Your personal data** shall be processed in accordance with the Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data<sup>1</sup>.

**The data controller** of the processing operation is ENISA (Policy Unit).

**The legal basis** for the processing operation is:

- Processing is necessary for the performance of tasks in the public interest in line with Article 5(1) (a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, on the basis of Regulation (EU) 2019/8812, in particular the provisions establishing the tasks of ENISA.
- Where it concerns the publication (full, partial, or no publication) of the replies as well as the contact data of the data subjects on the ENISA website, consent of the data subjects is provided in accordance with Article 5(1) (d) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725.

**The purpose** of this processing operation is to receive the views of citizens and stakeholders concerned by the specific topic of the consultation, and to publish these views on the ENISA website subject to the consent of the respondents.

**The data processor** of this processing operation is the European Commission's official survey management tool "EUSurvey". This tool is used to receive the replies to the consultation and general information regarding the parties submitting the replies. **The following personal data are being processed by ENISA:**

- Contact data: such as first name, last name, country, organisational affiliation, e-mail address.
- Any personal details that are voluntarily provided by the respondent in the replies to the consultation questions. ENISA generally advises data subjects to refrain from including personal data in their replies.

**The recipients** of the data will be:

- Designated ENISA staff involved in the data processing operation, as well as the relevant data processor (the “EUSurvey” tool).
- Subject to the explicit consent of the data subject, the content of the replies along with the contact data (full name and/or country and/or organisational affiliation) of the data subject may be published on the ENISA website. Data subjects may opt for full publication, partial publication, or no publication of their replies and/or their contact data.
- The data may also be available to EU bodies charged with monitoring or inspection tasks in application of EU law (e.g. internal audits, European Anti-fraud Office – OLAF).

**Personal data will be kept** up to a maximum period of 5 years after the closing date of the consultation for audit purposes.

**You have the right of** access to your personal data and to relevant information concerning how we use it. You have the right to rectify your personal data. Under certain conditions, you have the right to ask that we delete your personal data or restrict its use. You have the right to object to our processing of your personal data, on grounds relating to your particular situation, at any time. We will consider your request, take a decision and communicate it to you.
